

MotorSport New Zealand to suspend all events for two months

Following yesterday's announcement MotorSport New Zealand wants to share with you the decision to suspend all MotorSport New Zealand permitted events, at all levels, initially for two months in response to the fast-evolving COVID-19 situation, effective immediately until May 19th.

Following a meeting between MotorSport New Zealand Management and the Board, it was decided that the most important thing to consider amid COVID-19 was the safety and wellbeing of all members of our sport, those that offer their services at events, the community in general and spectators.

In making this significant decision, both Management and the Board hope that the sport might be able to return to some form of business as usual before the two month period in the event the COVID-19 situation shows signs of improvement.

Naturally, this suspension will be subject to ongoing review and advice from both the Ministry of Health and Government generally.

MotorSport New Zealand understands the financial impact COVID-19 will have on our Clubs and are actively investigating all avenues to ease the financial burden.

MotorSport New Zealand also is aware of the disruption and uncertainty this will create, and the Board and Management will provide a further update with additional information in due course.

MotorSport New Zealand office closure

MotorSport House, the office of MotorSport New Zealand will be closed to the public for the until further notice due to the COVID-19 situation.

MotorSport New Zealand staff will continue to work remotely, business as usual, ensuring the sport does not get left behind. Staff will be contactable by phone and email during normal business hours. The main phone number (04 815 8015) will remain operational.

New Year Honours: Don O'Connor - from behind the wheel to behind the scenes

In half a century devoted to motorsport clubs, Don O'Connor has only held one paid position.

Everything else the Taranaki man has done, including building record-breaking cars and helping establish Speedway New Zealand, has been as a volunteer.


Which is why he has been named a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the 2020 New Year Honours for his services to motorsport.

O'Connor raced motorcycles as a teenager, started getting into cars and has now been building the vehicles for decades.

Today, at the age of 75, he rebuilds and drives motorbikes, but spends more time helping out behind the scenes than behind the wheel.

"When I was young, in the 60s, a lot of people helped me," O'Connor said.

"The only thing that holds sports together is the volunteers - the people who do it for the love of it."



Don O'Connor, of Taranaki, has been named a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the New Years Honours for his service to motorsport.

O'Connor, a granddad-of-three, joined the Taranaki Motorcycle Club in the 1970s and held a number of roles in the club, including president.

"I was motorbike mad."

In the years that followed he helped found Speedway New Zealand, and separate the sport that was heavily linked with motorcycles at the time.

"We gained the support of all the speedway clubs in New Zealand.

"I'm quite proud of what we've achieved in Speedway."

He became its first chief executive and is now a life member.

In his time O'Connor also designed a small car at the kitchen table, went downstairs and built it, and his son Rodney, now 45, went on to win a New Zealand title in it.

The car even holds some hill climb records..

O'Connor said he'd always been interested in the administration side of sports and helping out where he could.

O'Connor said he couldn't have done anything without help from his wife Glenys, their daughter Jenn Patterson, 43, and son Rodney.

"You can't run a team without a whole family involved. It doesn't happen without the support."

In the early 2000s, he helped build 10 training motorbikes for young people to learn to race on. They sold two and gave the other eight to clubs around New Zealand.

O'Connor was still racing motorbikes into his 60s.

He said people often stop him on the street and say 'hello' and ask how he is - but he doesn't recognise them all.

"A lifetime of that must count for something."



O'Connor, 75, has been racing motorbikes since he was a teenager and quickly got into cars too.

Knox Petrolheads and their cunning plan to go motor racing - update

Knox Petrolheads and their cunning plan to go motor racing update

What a difference the new year brings. We now have a car, but no event to race it in as, due to the COVID-19 crisis, all motorsport events in New Zealand have been postponed or cancelled. So we wait to see what will happen next. Anyway on to the update.

We now have a car, a 1992 Toyota FX GT, 1600 20 valve - silver top engine. We saw it on Trade Me on the 23rd Dec, and made an offer for it on the 24th, which was accepted. Two of us drove up to Pokeno with a car trailer on the 11th Jan and brought it back. It was bought sight unseen, which is not ideal but we felt that it was the best one that we had seen to date and that we needed to move quickly. It has a full MSNZ certified cage and logbook, no WOF or rego, as last on the road in 2014. It was bought by the seller in 2014 for 2K cup racing and was prepared for this series – cage, seats, belts, new radiator, battery, TRD wheel rims and a heavy duty clutch fitted along with oil temp, water temp and oil pressure gauges. However he never raced it and then he decided to go V8 ute racing so needed to sell the car.

Once we got it back a few things needed to be done, including some we weren't expecting. The obvious list of things to do included: Replacing passenger door handle (external handle broken), getting spare keys cut (only had one key), fitting a new fire extinguisher with a new holder (only one strap and due to expire 2020), fixing the emergency electrical switch as not wired correctly, get the interior ventilation fan working, finding the oil leak from in behind the power steering unit, and fixing the rev counter (only reading to 2,000 rpm). So everything apart from the oil leak was fixed – it is only a small one and only happens when the engine is running – we suspect it is the new fuel pressure gauge switch, but need to remove the power steering unit to get to it so that is a job for me during the lockdown.



It was decided (by me) that I would enter it in the TCC De Havilland Drive sprint to give it a bit of a workout and see what else needed doing – as it is only by driving it that some things become evident. So it was off to scrutineering, which was its' first one ever! It still had the notation in the log book that the roll cage needed to be inspected. This showed up a few small items, which I attended to and then it was off to the sprint.

On the day the there were some positives, and negatives. First the positives. It handled like a go kart, great brakes, grippy tyres, great handling – soooooo different to the P76! The negatives: Engine died at high revs. Off the line it went well and then just lost power, I changed the plugs and that made no difference. Very frustrating and I lost a lot of time as couldn't keep the power on when I needed it. Also had to drive with my head at an angle due to the roll cage in the way, so will look to drop the seat by about 30mm (if I can) so that it is more comfortable for the taller drivers in the Lemons team. The change from 1st to 2nd is a bit graunchy – there is definitely a knack to it. However we can live with that for the time being, although a 2nd hand gearbox is only \$200 off Trade Me if required.

Knox Petrolheads and their cunning plan to go motor racing - update

Once home I decided to investigate the loss of power. First thing is to look at the fuel. Undo the fuel line at the fuel filter and orange fuel comes out. I know what that means so the fuel tank is removed, some POR 15 fuel tank treatment purchased and the tank is treated and reinstated, along with a new fuel filter. Excellent, it now revs all the way to the red line (8,000 rpm) and goes like stink. Bring on the next event!!!!

And now we wait for the next event. The Lemons 24 hour at Hampton Downs in May has been postponed until further notice. And with the lockdown some of us are on reduced earnings (one has no job) so we will have to wait and see as to what we do in the future. It will definitely be at future car club events – I need something to drive while I get the P76 sorted.


